1) Jharkhand is a Tribal rich state. Ranchi University exclusively has faculty of Tribal and Regional Languages (TRL) to protect and promote Jharkhand's social, cultural and traditional heritage. TRL has nine Departments in different Languages. These are Departments of Ho, Khortha, Kurmali, Kurux, Mundari, Nagpuri, Panch Pargania and Santali.

2) Department of Botany runs a course in Ethnobotany with an emphasis on research work in the field of traditional knowledge systems.

3) Home Science give education on Indian traditional textile while Yoga and Jyotirvigyan programs emphasis on traditional Indian Knowledge system.

4) Courses are offered in different Languages like Hindi, Urdu, Sanskrit and other Indian Languages to spread the versatility of knowledge.

Ranchi University implemented outcome-based education (OBE) at the Undergraduate level in the current session and is going to implement the same at Post Graduate level in the coming session.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS
1.1 - Curriculum Design and Development
1.1.1 - Curricula developed and implemented have relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs which is reflected in Programme outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes(PSOs) and Course Outcomes(COs) of the Programmes offered by the University
The courses in all the programmes of Ranchi University, Ranchi are developed and implemented having relevance to local, national and global developmental needs. Each department that offers any programme has a Board of studies comprising faculty members (Internal), subject experts (External) and student representatives, who approve the syllabus of any programme after thorough discussions. They present programme outcomes, programme-specific outcomes and course outcomes. The Board of Studies of each department oversees the relevancy and requirements of any course in the programmes that the department offers. As the Board of Studies is conducted every year, it revises courses as per needs. Though minor revision is a common practice, major revision is also done when required. Ranchi University adopted a Choice Based Credit System from 2018 onwards for all its programmes. Recently, Ranchi University, Ranchi implemented New Education Policy 2020 in June 2022. Students and teacher's feedbacks are also used for the upgradation of the curricula. For research programmes, the courses are discussed first in the Departmental Research Committees (DRCs) and then recommended to the Academic Council of the
University where they are again discussed for final approval. Objective of programmes are written at the beginning of courses of many programmes offered by the University.

All the programmes at Ranchi University offer at least one course that integrates issues relevant to Professional Ethics or Gender or Human values or Environment and Sustainability. They mostly form the Generic Elective courses under Choice Based Credit System, but there are also independent programmes that are based on these issues Such as Corporate Governance, Ethics and Social Responsibility of Business (Commerce), Biofertilizers, Mushroom Cultivation (Botany), Environmental Chemistry (Chemistry), Environmental Geology (Geology), Ecology (Zoology), Development of Women in History (History), Ecology and Environmental Management, Indian Socio-economic Development and Statue of Women (Home Science), Value Based Education, Indian Ethics (Philosophy), Gender and Development (Psychology), etc. The University has got the approval for starting a new certificate course in Forestry, Climate Change and Wildlife. Almost all the regular P. G. Programmes integrate these issues as independent courses. The courses related to gender issues are aimed at promoting gender equality and focus on women's empowerment. The courses related to the environment covers topic like Global Warming, Environmental Policy, Environmental Protection, Disaster Management, Solid Waste Management and So on. Ranchi University itself is involved in rainwater harvesting, making the campus green by continuous plantation, waste management, using solar energy and so on. Ranchi University integrates courses that teach human values into its curriculum. Almost all programmes integrate and teach professional ethics. Ph. D Programmes that specifically deal with issues related to professional ethics in research methodology.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

To effectively meet students' learning goals, all Departments at Ranchi University have implemented student-centric teaching and learning pedagogies. Interactive lectures in the classroom enable students to participate in fruitful debates, transforming the ordinary classroom into an area for knowledge expansion. Students are urged to use self-driven, problemsolving strategies to help them become more aware of the practical applications of their knowledge. Individual and group-based seminars, presentations and discussions, exams, brief projects and assignments, research-based projects, periodic seminars, Chancellor lecture series, and internships are only a few examples of varied participatory teaching-learning techniques. The optimization of interactive material includes a focus on small group interactions through tutorials, projects/presentations, and group-based tasks. Role plays, field/exposure visits, and case studies/best practices are all incorporated into the educational process by faculty members. In order to broaden students' knowledge and keep them informed about global academic and research advances, it is also often organized to hold workshops, National/International seminars, lectures by invited experts and industry professionals, and seminars on topical subjects.

The University's examination department is efficient, accessible, fair, and transparent. It is a multifaceted system with a wide range of activities designed to provide students with a seamless, time-bound experience. In-house built software is used by Ranchi University's well- organized and IT-integrated examination administration system, which successfully incorporates information technology and reforms in the examination procedures and processes. The university features both a University Headquarters Examination Center and an Examination Data Processing Cell (EDPC). The EDPC is the specific cell responsible for student registration, creating exam roll numbers and admit cards, assigning exam centres, entering and comparing marks entered by two different tabulators, and preparing and publishing results and certificates. The University Headquarter Examination Center registers students, creates exam rolls, prints admission cards, assigns exam sites, and compiles and publishes results and certificates for the Dental, Medical, Nursing, Law and Teacher Education Institutions that are affiliated with Ranchi University in Ranchi. The students of the University are continuously evaluated internally through the use of IT-integrated mid-semester exams, end-of-semester exams, assignments, presentations, projects, and dissertations.

7.2.1 - Describe one best practice successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Title

On Air Broadcasting of Lectures by faculties through University's own Community Radio, Radio Khanchi 90.4 FM

Objective :

- Fast and Wide spread of lectures among students.
- Ontime completion of syllabus.
- Technology awareness among faculties and students.

Context:

During COVID period the teachers were asked to record their lectures which was broadcasted by Radio Khanchi and more than 40000 students of Ranchi University within the city and its periphery got benefited from the same.

Practice:

On Air lectures through radio is one of its kind concepts, all over India. Very few universities have taken such initiative. This idea is unique in higher education system.

Evidence of Success:

The idea was a great success as more than 40,000 students were benefitted from these lectures and performed well in their examination

Problems Encountered and Resources required:

Ranchi University has its own Community radio with a FM reach to 15 Kilometer so there was no additional expenditure on infrastructure.

Some of the teachers were not tech savvy and were not enthusiastic to record lectures in the beginning but online training enabled many teachers to record Lectures.

Notes:

It has become a consortium of more than 1600 lectures, available for students through YouTube, Instagram, Facebook and Twitter.
